What is this product?

Type

This product is a share of an investment company qualifying as an undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities (UCITS).

Term

This sub-fund has no maturity date. However, the board of directors may decide to close the sub-fund under certain circumstances.

Objectives

The sub-fund seeks performance superior to that of the main European stock markets for a period exceeding five years. Discretionary investment policy: when taking investment decisions, financial analysis of the companies takes precedence over the perception of the financial markets and the economic and political climate, which supports these decisions.

The sub-fund can invest:

- at least 75% of its net assets in shares of listed companies having their registered office in a Member State of the EU or another State in the European Economic Area;
- up to 100% of its net assets in shares of European companies outside the euro zone;
- up to 25% of its net assets in listed equities, having their registered office in countries belonging to the Council of Europe and that are not already part of the EEA;
- up to 20% of its net assets in the shares of listed companies having their registered offices in emerging European countries that do not belong to the OECD.

The sub-fund may occasionally invest up to 20% of its net assets in equity equivalent securities or bonds (convertible bonds, bonds with warrants, priority dividend shares, investment certificates, equity securities). Investment in equities is performed without any sectoral, capital or monetary restrictions. When investing its cash balance, the sub-fund may invest up to 25% of its net assets in bonds from issuers rated at least AA (S&P or equivalent). The sub-fund will not invest in Negotiable Debt Securities. It may invest up to 10% of its net assets in units of UCITS and/or other UCIs, including money market UCITS.

It may, from time to time, trade in traded or optional forward financial instruments:

- to hedge them against drops in the equity or foreign exchange markets;
- to improve their performance by seeking out a better buy or sell price. Exposure will be limited to 100% of the assets.

Benchmark: Given the discretionary management style, the composition of the portfolio will not seek to replicate the composition of a benchmark index at a geographical or sector level. The sub-fund is actively managed without reference to a reference index. However, the Morningstar Developed Markets Europe net return index, denominated in euros, may be used as an ex-post performance indicator.

Intended investor

This product is intended for investors seeking income and capital growth over the medium- to long-term (at least 5 years). The investor may incur losses up to the amount invested. This product is suitable for investors with basic and in-depth knowledge and experience of the product and the global equity markets.

Other information

Depositary: Banque de Luxembourg

Dividend income: This class is a capitalisation class meaning that income is reinvested.

Conversion right: The investor has the right to convert his investment in shares in one sub-fund for shares in the same sub-fund or in another sub-fund. The investor can obtain information about how to convert in the prospectus of the fund.

Segregation: The assets and liabilities of a sub-fund are segregated pursuant to the law so that the commitments and liabilities of one sub-fund do not affect the other sub-funds.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level, and poor market conditions could impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. You may receive payments in a currency that differs from your reference currency, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

What happens if CLARTAN SICAV is unable to pay out?

If we are not able to pay you out what we owe you, you are not covered by any national compensation or guarantee scheme. To protect you, the assets are held with a separate company, the depositary Banque de Luxembourg. Should we default, the investments are liquidated and the proceeds are distributed to the investors. In the worst case, however, you could lose your entire investment.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding period we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 5 years

You should be prepared to stay invested for 5 years. However, you can redeem your investment without penalty at any time during this time, or hold the investment longer. Redemptions are possible on each full bank business day in Luxembourg. In exceptional circumstances, your right to request the redemption of your investment may be limited or suspended.
